That's why I wondered if perhaps DNA test results about disease/medical susceptibilities would be more useful to the donor's progeny than knowing where features like high foreheads and bushy eyebrows came from. Perhaps this will be more of an issue as they age.

I also can't help wondering if the women who availed themselves of the sperm bank ever envisioned that their children would one day have access to information that was not available to them at the time, or perhaps even now. Did they or do others similarly situated have what is called an "expectation of privacy" in these matters? Were any waivers or statements of consent ever considered or sought?
